

PRE-REQUISITES EXAMPLES

Grade 12 English (ENG4U) is required for all programs

- Arts...
- ENG4U and next top 5 U/M courses
- Business...
- 1 or 2 grade 12 math courses (one should be Advanced Functions)
- Science....
- -usually at least 2 of the three sciences (SBI4U, SCH4U, SPH4U)
- -Advanced Functions
- -many require Calculus & Vectors
- Fine Arts...
- -audition or portfolio

REQUIRED VS RECOMMENDED

- Required:
- you must have the course to be considered for the program
- will be calculated in the average of your six
- Recommended:
- > a good idea
- will not be counted if it is not in your top six
- may need upgrading course in university




